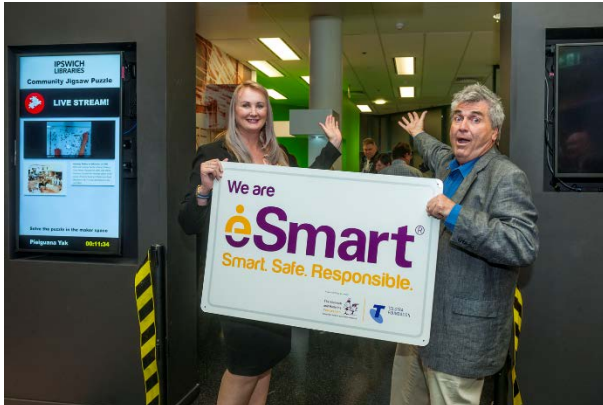


## Ipswich Libraries, QLD

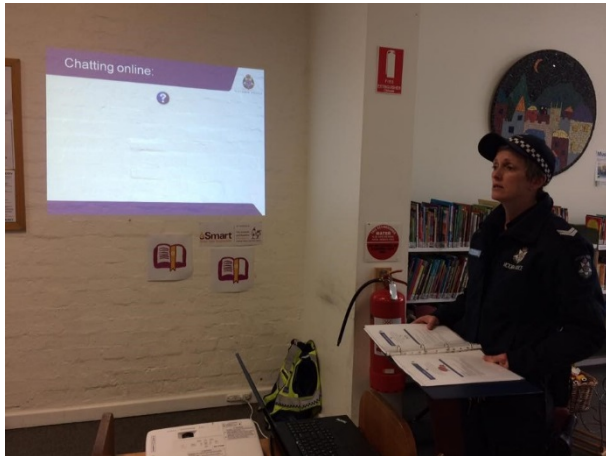
Councillor Ann Luke pulled back the red curtain to officially launch Gunnedah Library as an eSmart Library.
