COMPUTER, INTERNET AND WI-FI USE IN THE LIBRARY

Public access computers are provided free of charge in the libraries.

Customers will be required to book access to these computers. Bookings are for a period of 30 minutes (or less) or 1 hour. Customers must leave at the end of their allotted time when requested to by library staff.

Council has installed filtering software, however it is the responsibility of a parent or guardian to supervise the internet usage for a minor.

Free WiFi is also available for use with personal portable devices. It is the customer's responsibility to ensure that they are able to access the network from their device. Library staff are unable to assist with the use of personal devices. Council accepts no responsibility for any damages, direct or indirect, arising from use of its public access computers or Wifi.

Acceptable use of these resources includes:

- Respect for the privacy of others
- Attention to the legal protection provided by copyright and license to programs and data
- Consideration for the security and functioning of the library's computers, networks and systems
- Adherence to the booking conditions for SRRC library public access computers

In consideration of other users, headphones must be used if accessing sound on the computers. Headphones are not provided in the library, customers should bring their own.

Unacceptable use of these resources includes but is not limited to:

- Using SRRC library service computers for any purpose that violates federal or state laws, transmits threatening, obscene or harassing materials, or interferes with, or disrupts network users, services or equipment.
- Destruction of, or damage to, equipment, software or data belonging to SRRC
- Accessing, displaying, downloading or printing material that is offensive or objectionable to other members of the public. This includes but is not limited to pornography, expressions of racial hatred, violence and/or obscenity.
- Breaching copyright legislation
- Customers representing themselves as another person, either in person or online.
- Users are welcome to bring in data files to access on the library computers, but no executable programs are to be loaded or run from the internet or removable media, e.g. DVDs, CDs, USB drives, etc.









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
