

The Australian Cyber crime Online Reporting Network (ACORN)

The Australian Cybercrime Online Reporting Network (ACORN) is a national policing initiative of the Commonwealth, State and Territory governments.

It is a national online system that allows the public to securely report instances of cybercrime. It will also provide advice to help people recognise and avoid common types of cybercrime.

The ACORN provides information on how to recognise and avoid common forms of cybercrime (hacking, online scams, online fraud, identity theft and attacks on computer systems) as well as advice for those who have fallen victim.

It also makes reporting cybercrime easier and more convenient for all Australians.
