- Look through the Yellow Pages to discover what companies might employ people in the trade or occupation you are considering and contact them as part of your research. Be sure to check out the WBF website as well.

#### **Trade/Occupation Interviews**

As part of the Career Investigation Process, you are required to conduct interviews with individuals who have experience in your trade or occupation of interest.

- For Grant Funding, you will need 3 interviews. For example 3 Journeymen Carpenters (1 may be an apprentice)
- For Employer Sponsored programs you will need 2 interviews (although the more you do the more knowledge you gain)
- Research your trade/occupation of interest before you start your interviews. Personalize your questions to ensure you get the
  information you need for your decision-making. Be conscious about when you are calling them, and make sure that they have
  time to talk to you. This process can take some time so do not get discouraged.
- Check the WBF website for any **New Application Support Sessions**, were we have our staff and resources available to you to support you in completing the career investigation application.
- Use this as an opportunity to learn as much as you can. Use the points in each section below to guide your discussion and use the sample interview questions in the Resource and Referral Guide available on each program page on the WBF website.
